# **Administrator's News**

The conquest of the Promised Land was nearing completion seven years after the children of Israel had crossed the Jordan River with Joshua and Caleb. Battles had been fought, cities were being settled, and land allotments had been established. The tribes of Rueben, Gad, and the half tribe of Manasseh were preparing to cross back over the Jordan to their land on the east side of the river. They had left their land and families to help the other tribes conquer the land and now they are returning. Joshua gathers them and gives them his parting instructions and words.

"You have done all that Moses the servant of the LORD commanded, and you have obeyed me in everything I commanded. For a long time now-to this very day-you have not deserted your fellow Israelites but have carried out the mission the LORD your God gave you. Now that the LORD your God has given them rest as he promised, return to your homes in the land that Moses the servant of the LORD gave you on the other side of the Jordan. But be very careful to keep the commandment and the law that Moses the servant of the LORD gave you: to love the LORD your God, to walk in obedience to him, to keep his commands, to hold fast to him and to serve him with all your heart and with all your soul." Joshua 22:2-5

His instruction to them had five parts, to keep God's laws, to love the Lord, to walk in obedience, to hold fast to Him and to serve Him wholeheartedly. These instructions are vital to our own walk as believers, but recently the phrase that has caught my attention is his instruction to hold fast to the Lord. This idea of holding fast is easy for us to understand. If we slip on an icy sidewalk, we reach out to snatch the hand of a friend nearby. If you are falling off a cliff and we are able to grasp on to a shrub, we would cling to it. But what about the Lord? Are we holding fast to Him? Are we clinging to Him? Or is our hold weak and momentary? Do we take His hand when we have fear, but release it as the fear subsides? Do we only cling to Him in the darkness of a trial and let go as the path brightens and widens?

The apostle Paul had a similar instruction for the church of Thessalonica. So then, brothers and sisters, stand firm and hold fast to the teachings we passed on to you, whether by word of mouth or by letter. II Thessalonians 2:15

My prayer is that we heed the instructions and truth of God's Word, that we hold fast to the Lord and His teachings and that our response is echoed in the psalmist's words,

Be gracious to me and teach me your law. I have chosen the way of faithfulness; I have set my heart on your laws. I will hold fast to your statutes, LORD. Psalm 119:29-31 Amen and Amen.
