Scientists tell us that smell is the most influential sense that our brain possesses. Smells are stored in our long-term memory and is a powerful trigger for emotions and memory.

"From a first encounter with a smell, we begin intertwining forming nerve connections recognition of the scent with nostalgia and behavior. Incoming smells are first processed inside the nose and the smell information is transmitted to the key regions of the brain's system associated with emotions and memory, which in turn, influences how we react to the scent." (The science of scent, Psychology Today, 2014).

Knowing this, we see the Lord's grace for Peter in John 21. It is early morning after the events of the crucifixion and resurrection. Peter's mind must have still been on his rejection of Jesus on the night of His trial, his denial of His Lord and dear friend in a time of suffering and sorrow. Peter had stood by the fire in the courtyard and three times vehemently denied even knowing His Lord. The sounds and smells of that night were still fresh in his memory, the chill of the air and the smell of the charcoal fire that warmed the courtyard.

And on the shores of the sea, Jesus restored Peter. He built a fire and prepared a breakfast of fish and bread. But I believe it was the smell of the charcoal fire that caught Peter's attention first. The same smell as the night in the courtyard, the memories of denying his Lord, the humiliation of it all.

And Jesus in His compassion, His grace, and His love walked with Peter and asks him, "Do you love Me?" not once or twice, but three times. Restoring Peter in love, Jesus spoke to the innermost part of Peter, to his emotions, his memory, his heart. Jesus used how Peter was created to restore him to grace; three times Jesus spoke of restoration as the charcoal fire burned nearby.

So how is the Lord speaking to you today? Demonstrating His forgiveness, His compassion, His grace. Can you hear His voice, calling you back to Him in love? And He says to you as He said to Peter, "Follow Me."

When they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon, son of John, do you love me more than these?" He said to him, "Yes, Lord; you know that I love you." He said to him, "Feed my lambs." He said to him a second time, "Simon, son of John, do you love me?" He said to him, "Yes, Lord; you know that I love you." He said to him, "Tend my sheep." He said to him the third time, "Simon, son of John, do you love me?" Peter was grieved because he said to him the third time, "Do you love me?" and he said to him, "Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Feed my sheep.

And after saying this he said to him, "Follow me." John 21:15-17, 19

Amy says, "I have enjoyed starting the resource program here. I get to work with students in K-8th grade!"




Quiz Bowl Victory - by Mr. Bookless, High School Math Teacher



On Saturday, March 3, 2018, AP Physics students from Cornerstone Christian participated in the Nebraska 2018 Model Bridge Contest held at the Edgerton Exporit Center in Aurora, Nebraska. Of the 22 bridges that were tested, Akela Dramse and Lane Kieser placed 9th and Caleb Will placed 13th. Akela Dramse and Lane Kieser's bridge weighed 14.4 grams and supported a weight of 36.9 lbs, for an efficiency of 1162.4. Caleb Will's bridge weighed 15.1 grams and supported a weight of 27.7 lbs, for an efficiency of 832.1.

Caleb Will received an Award of Merit, a trophy and a check for \$50 for, in the opinion of the judges, neatness of construction, good craftsmanship, and general eye-pleasing appearance.
