
Christmas Program

The 2013-2014 budget is illustrated in the accompanying chart. The right-hand side reflects the annual income which includes tuition payments and donations such as Walk-a-thon and year-end giving. The lefthand side reflects all expenses, including payroll, leases to the two facilities, curriculum purchases, etc. CCS currently has 236 students enrolled and 38 staff which includes full and part-time teachers, office support staff, paraprofessionals, and after-school care directors. The schools strives to maintain a reasonable tuition schedule and the school board sets an annual budget based on enrollment. Conducting school business in a fiscally sound manner is important to CCS and the Lord has provided graciously for the school year after year.
