Administrator's News

Our days are filled with questions- asking questions, answering questions, solving questions. Whether you are five and the question is "What is two plus two?" or you are much older and the question is much more challenging and complex. But one of the greatest questions is asked in Mark 10. Jesus asks the same question two different times and get two very different responses.

James and John approach Jesus with a very bold request. Now, we are told in Scripture to ask of the Lord and I believe that the Lord wants us to ask of Him boldly, but this request is not only bold, but very self-seeking. Jesus turns to them, "What do you want me to do for you?" (Mark 10: 36) James and John replied, "Let one of us sit at your right and the other at your left in your glory." They asked to be placed in the seat of prominence, to receive honor while in His presence for eternity. This request was one of arrogance, selfishness, and pride. Jesus response to them was one of sorrow. "You do not know what you are asking."

Now contrast that to another request just hours later. Bartimaeus, a blind beggar at the gate of Jericho, hears that Jesus is passing by and calls out to Him, "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!" The crowd tries to silence him, perhaps mocking him and scorning him for his boldness, his audacity that he, a beggar, is calling out to Jesus. But Jesus stopped and called for him to be brought to Jesus. He looks at the blind beggar and asks the same question that He had just asked of His disciples. "What do you want me to do for you?" (Mark 10:51) Bartimaeus answers, full of faith, boldly, "I want to see."

What a bold, audacious request! A blind beggar standing before Jesus of Nazareth, the Lord of Lords, the King of Kings, makes a request. "I want to see." Yes, he was asking for physical sight, but I know that he was asking for even more than that. He was asking to see God's grace, to see God's love, and most importantly, to see God's glory. And the Lord in His grace and mercy and everlasting love answered this beggar's bold and audacious request.

So today, Jesus, the Lord of Lords, the King of Kings, is standing before you with this same question. "What do you want me to do for you?" And what is your response? Today ask a bold and audacious request of Him. Ask to see His grace, to see His love, and most importantly, to see His glory.

Whatever you ask in My name, this I will do, that the Father may be glorified in the Son. If you ask Me anything in My name, I will do it. John 14:13-14

Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God.






