"Discipleship is not an offer that man makes to Christ. When Christ calls a man, he bids him come and die." Dietrich Bonhoeffer

Cornerstone Christian School is a discipleship Christian school dedicated to bringing the Lord glory through every aspect of our school. But what does it mean to be a disciple? Jesus's call to discipleship is a threefold call. First, this is a call to know Him. This knowing is a personal commitment to the Lord, not just to know of Him, but to know Him by personal experience and depth of understanding. That I may know him and the power of his resurrection, and may share his sufferings, becoming like him in his death, that by any means possible I may attain the resurrection from the dead. (Phil. 3:10-11)

Second, the call to discipleship is a call to follow Jesus. He demands complete, exclusive, and unwavering obedience to Him. This obedience is an abandoned surrender to His will, His plans and purposes. And he said to all, If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me (Luke 9:23)

Third, the call to discipleship is a call to make disciples. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age. (Matthew 28:19-20)

When asked "what does discipleship look like for a Cornerstone Christian student?" the CCS teaching staff can described their goals for students in this manner. A CCS student will:

- Know Christ as the Truth
- Have a true repentance and humble obedience
- Study the Bible and have a consistent devotional life
- Be a leader and role model for others
- Be empathetic and "other" focused with quiet acts of love, compassion, honor, and service
- Apply the Truth of God's Word to their lives and demonstrate the Truth
- Work for the glory of the Lord and not just for a grade or a score
- Demonstrate the fruit of the Spirit daily and outwardly
- Continue the cycle of making disciples

Linda was born in Ogallala, Nebraska. Her family made several moves then settled in Albion, Nebraska, where Linda graduated high school. After high school, she moved to Omaha to attend Grace Bible Institute (later named Grace University). There she met her husband of 45 years. Keith and Linda have three daughters, Sheri, Michelle & LaVae and 8 grandchildren (with one more soon to be adopted). Two of Linda's grandchildren attend Cornerstone.



The Saver family lived in Montana for 10 years on the high line, which is the east/west road the closest to Canada. Keith taught school while Linda stayed home with the children. Then they were called to Missouri to be missionaries with Missions Outreach International.
