

We are all aware of the words from II Timothy 3:16-17, "All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work."

On the academic side of CCC, this is our goal - "training" AND helping disciples " *be complete, equipped for every good work.*" Jesus trained His disciples in the Father's truth. They trained the second generation of the church in God's truth. And that work has continued throughout the centuries. Using God's Word to teach and train disciples.

Our calling at CCC is to the nations. We want to train church leaders with and in God's word. However, if they live in Malawi, Cuba, Laos, or Nepal it might be difficult for them to attend a brick and mortar institute in Bellevue, NE. Cornerstone Christian College wants to take the classes to them. We will have classes on-line Bible classes that will help teach and train. John the Baptist, Jesus, Paul - they all did more than teach the Word of God to their disciples. They built relationships with those they were discipling. How do we do that in an on-line format? We cannot - but those already in country can! That is why our missionary partners are so important! They will lead a co-hort through our program. It will be our classes, our instructors - but the relationships will be built by the missionary on the ground. In fact, our hope is that the missionary will already have a relationship with the members of each cohort. The classes of CCC will be a tool they can use as the missionary continues the discipling process with their flock.

Cornerstone, starting as an elementary school and growing to a full pre-K- 12 school, is now expanding to a college. As the college will have multiple components of instructors, missionaries in the field who lead the cohorts, and missional students across the nations, we understand that one important need will be missionary care. Our pillars of this work are Networking, Encouragement, Oneness, Nurturing, and Creativity and in this structure, we will serve to encourage and nurture the missionaries and students. The role of Cornerstone Christian College will be to care by helping to establish a culture which provides shared best practices for the advocacy of each mission site to include prayer, intercession, counseling, and networking resources.

The model for our work can be seen in I Peter as we are given the Lord's heart for us. We are to love one another deeply. So our role will be to encourage, and nurture, and care for the missionaries and missional students- to love them deeply.
