She showed no mercy when I explained it was a first offense and the crime committed was intended to help my academic standing. She said for good order and discipline, I must be punished.

It is like that with our sin. No matter the reason. action, or thought, disobedience must be punished. Romans 6:23 outlines the cost or wages of our sin as much more severe than marches or confinements but as death, eternal death. Unlike my Academy Commander, God showed Mercy and gifted His Son, Jesus to pay for our disobedience. Romans 6:23 declares, the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord. God sent His Only Begotten Sinless Son, Jesus, to take our punishment and pay for our sins with His death on the cross and He (God) made Him (Jesus) who had no sin to be sin on our behalf, so that we might become the righteousness of God in Him."
