We know that we are to walk near to the Lord, but each day we need clarity in this, direction, to be shown the path, the way. The Lord spoke of this to His disciples. He promised them a Comforter, a Helper, to walk with them day by day.

And I will pray the Father, and he shall give you another Comforter, that he may abide with you forever. John 14:16

And He instructed them before His ascension to wait in Jerusalem for the baptizing of this Comforter, the Holy Spirit. They were to wait for the fulfillment of this promise.

And while staying with them he ordered them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for the promise of the Father, which, he said, "You heard from me; for John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now." Acts 1:4-5
