For in the day of trouble he will keep me safe in his dwelling; he will hide me in the shelter of his sacred tent and set me high upon a rock.

Then my head will be exalted above the enemies who surround me; at his sacred tent I will sacrifice with shouts of joy; I will sing and make music to the LORD.

Hear my voice when I call, LORD; be merciful to me and answer me. My heart says of you, "Seek his face!" Your face, LORD, I will seek. Psalm 27:1-8

Eighteen years ago, I was preparing for my first trip into Taiwan to work at the orphanage in Luodung in Yilan County. Every time I travel for missions, I memorize a Scripture as my theme for the trip and for my first trip into Taiwan, the Lord lead me to Psalm 27. This passage already had a special place in my heart as it was my grandmother's favorite verses and, in the weeks, leading up to the trip, I would read these words over and over, putting them to memory. And in the weeks that I was at the Home of God's Love in Luodung, these truths echoed in my heart and still come to mind over and over, especially these words, "Seek His face."

We all have an understanding of what it means to seek and a good definition is to search or go in quest of, to try to discover, as by studying, or to ask for, request. But what does this look like as we seek the Lord's face? Do we ask Him to give wisdom in decisions? Do we humble ourselves under His direction? Do we rest in His peace? Do we rejoice in His blessings and love? In all this, we are seeking His face! So in this day, let us:

- search and go in quest of His truth and grace
- try to discover by studying His word
- ask for and request His wisdom and peace

Seek the Lord while he may be found; call on him while he is near. Isaiah 55:6

But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you. Matthew 6:33

Please contact the school office by 9:00 AM to confirm an absence or tardy for your child.



If your child has been ill, please be sure they are fever free for 24 hours before returning to school.





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9th Grade Bible Class Visual Reflections on Psalm 19
