For the last nine years, she has served as a high school receptionist and Office Support Specialist. Besides her first love of greeting students, staff and visitors, she says she thoroughly enjoys tasks such as producing the monthly Chronicle, and creating and updating CCS documents, brochures and signs to make Cornerstone look good!





René's connection to Cornerstone began years ago when her children attended Cornerstone. Now she feels blessed that her grandchildren, Olivia and Paxton, attend here.

Growing up as a member of a military family, René lived in many places including California, Georgia, Wisconsin, Mississippi and Japan. After her father retired from the Air Force, the family moved to Lincoln, Nebraska when her dad took a job at Back to the Bible Broadcast.

She graduated from Lincoln High School and then moved to Omaha to attend Grace University (then Grace Bible Institute) where she received a diploma in Christian Education. She continued her schooling at the University of Nebraska at Omaha, earning a Bachelor's Degree in Education. She taught school at Bellevue Christian Academy and Springfield Elementary. She received a Master's Degree in Computer's in Education from Lesley College in Massachusetts.

During the decade of the 1990s, René felt privileged to help move Grace University into the "computer age" as she served as the Computer Application professor. She said that two of her favorite parts of that job were providing computer education to the other professors at Grace and helping students learn to use the computer for their future ministries.

Years before, while a student at Grace, René met her soulmate, Mike. René and Mike were married for 37 years and God blessed them with two sons and a daughter. In 2010, Mike was promoted to glory after confidently and patiently trusting God through 10 years of cancer. René reflects on their years together, "It was amazing to be married to such a positive, Godly man."

Two years after Mike's death, the Lord led René to apply at Cornerstone. She Said, "My time at Cornerstone has been such an encouraging experience. Over the years, I have watched CCS children mature into confident, God-serving young adults under the guidance of our dedicated teachers and administration. I could not have asked for a better place to be for this season of my life. I will truly miss Cornerstone when I retire later this summer."

Fun Tidbit: In the early 1990's René had a side job selling educational robots. In addition, for about 15 years, she created and sold her photography and worship graphics locally and around the world, over the internet. Her works were translated into Danish, Swedish, Norwegian and Spanish.
