

On December 9th, High School Chapel went all day. Our speaker, Trevor Otto, challenged any of the students who felt lost - to go towards God. Sometimes when we feel lost from God, we focus on "I can't" and not "I can." We CAN because God is with us. Mr. Otto also challenged students to be disciple makers. He explained that discipling can be as simple as being in community/relationship with another person. To give them a chance to practice discipleship, students took a moment to pray for one another. He also had us pray over one of our students who broke her foot earlier this week.

As chapel ended, different pockets of students wanted to continue praying. Other students asked if we could do more worship later in the day. With some students continuing to pray with one another, we attempted to go on with school as normal. It was decided that we would have a time of worship during homeroom and lunch. People were not required to attend worship, but more and more students came to the chapel. Soon, prayer groups of all sizes were forming. And members of our worship team were singing.

I watched a group of 9th and 10th grade boys pray for each other, hug each other, and cry with each other. I soon found out that friendships were being restored and this led people wanting to grow closer to God. Young people were seeking prayer and seeking to pray for others. Teachers gave up class time to watch CCS students seek and worship God. The prayer and worship continued, and I felt led by God to not stop it. Finally, at 3pm I called everybody to chapel and read Luke 8 - the Parable of the Sower. So many seeds had been planted and it was important that we didn't grow fast with no roots or that we didn't let weeds/thorns choke us out. By the end of the day - nine people asked me if they could be baptized.

I have struggled to put into words all the work God did that day. It was too amazing, and God was too powerful for me to capture the scope of our all-day chapel. So many of your students sought God with their heart and lifted their friends to our Heavenly Father. The following morning, we had 7 baptisms! In a nutshell - our school will not be the same.
