One of the trademarks of Cornerstone is prayer and to this end, we have two prayer rooms available to students and teachers and parents. The students know our commitment to prayer, not out of duty, but out of the deepest understanding and knowing that our Heavenly Father knows our needs and our joys and welcomes our conversations with Him. To this end, we arrange prayer chapels in middle school and high school for extended times devoted to prayer for and with others. To this end, our teachers begin each day with prayer as a group and our school board meetings dedicate time to both corporate prayer and prayer walks of the campus. And to this end, I many times end my day in the high school chapel for times of quiet worship and prayer.

John Wesley, the English theologian who lived in the 1780's said, "God does nothing apart from prayer and everything through it." This is a strong truth and one that is deeply needed today- in our world and in our school.

This weekend, I spent time in the prayer room on the elementary level. 

This afterschool program brings in guest speakers and activities to Cornerstone. From historians to art projects, science to Legos, plants to animals, physical activity to games, we do our best to have a variety of options throughout the year.









How it Works is students go to the Activity Center at the end of the day, as if they would for dismissal. There, the teachers organize them into a group. When the time comes, a Beyond the Bell coordinator gathers the children for a snack prior to the guest speaker. The afternoon typically wraps up around 5pm, when parents can sign out their child or the child can be taken to Cougar Care for extended after school support.

To Register, Parents can sign their child(ren) up for a Beyond the Bell event when they are announced through email and flyers. Fees are due prior to the event (typically \$10-15 per student). Parent volunteers and snack donations are needed and can be offered in the sign-up process.

In 2021-22, we have served over 125 students, many of which came to multiple Beyond the Bell events. This represents more than 100 CCS families!


