From the Superintendent's Desk By Dr. Teri Lynn Schrag, Superintendent

Have you ever thought of the misnomer of "Lost and Found"? Truly, at a school, the bin needs to be labeled "Lost and Not Found". Your students can tell you that I dislike lost and found. The bin seems to be overflowing with the odds and ends of school- seven gloves (none of them matching), sweatshirts, library books, water bottles, and even one shoe. In fact, almost weekly, the office staff lays out the items and the teachers walk with their students by the items to check if anything that belongs to them. But even with this clever plan, the lost and found bin never is empty.

As I think of the dilemma of this never-ending problem, I am reminded that I could have a "lost and found" tag as well. John Newton, the reformed slave trader, said it well, "Amazing grace, How sweet the sound that saved a wretch like me. I once was lost, but now I am found, Was blind, but now I see." In notes from Newton's journal, March 21, 1748 was a day of great importance for him, for "On that day the Lord sent from on high and delivered me out of deep waters." Only God's amazing grace could and would take a rude, profane, slave-trading sailor and transform him into a child of God. And only God's grace can take us, a blasphemer of the Truth, an enemy of God, and transform us from a wretch to a beloved son and daughter.

Our new name in Christ can be "Was Once Lost, But Forever Found by His Grace and Mercy". What joy comes with His grace that overflows in Him!

I thank him who has given me strength, Christ Jesus our Lord, because he judged me faithful, appointing me to his service, though formerly I was a blasphemer, persecutor, and insolent opponent. But I received mercy because I had acted ignorantly in unbelief, and the grace of our Lord overflowed for me with the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus. The saying is trustworthy and deserving of full acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners, of whom I am the foremost. But I received mercy for this reason, that in me, as the foremost, Jesus Christ might display his perfect patience as an example to those who were to believe in him for eternal life. 
