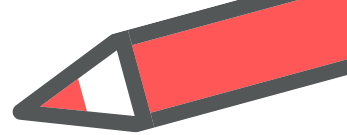




IN THE CLASSROOM

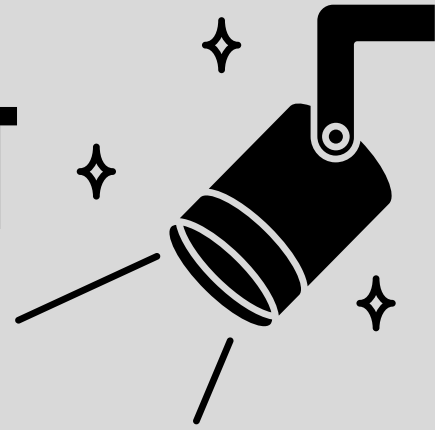
Kindergarten Line Rockets:

Katie Leonhard *High School Math*



Miss Leonhard grew up in seven different states: North Carolina, Illinois, Nebraska, Arizona, Georgia, Arkansas, and Texas! 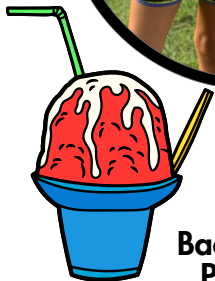
