### From the Superintendent's Desk

Living at the time of the prophet Isaiah, Micah prophesied during the years surrounding the fall of Israel to the Assyrian Empire in 722 BC. Surrounded by the unrighteous kings of Judah and the threats of the surrounding enemies of the Lord's chosen people, Micah had a profound question for the Lord. His question was not rhetorical, or one asked with sarcasm to receive a glib response. No, as he prophesies the coming judgement of the southern kingdom, he has an earnest question.

With what shall I come before the Lord and bow down before the exalted God? Shall I come before him with burnt offerings, with calves a year old? Will the Lord be pleased with thousands of rams, with ten thousand rivers of olive oil? Shall I offer my firstborn for my transgression, the fruit of my body for the sin of my soul? He has shown you, O man, what is good. And what does the Lord require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God. Micah 6:6-8

Those who worshipped the gods of the surrounding nations brought to their altars extravagant offerings to appease their gods, even offering up their children to be burned. And in the midst of this, Micah calls out to the God of gods, the King of Kings and Lord of Lords. "Lord, what offering do I need to bring? What can atone for our nation's sins? What gift will You require? What can I bring? What can redeem us?" Micah's desire is to please the Lord and will bring any offering required. And the LORD, our Yeshua, answers in His grace and mercy and compassion. "Micah, you know what is required of you, what is acceptable as a gift, and what you are to bring before Me. Micah, walk with Me. Act justly to the downtrodden and the desperate. Love mercy. Love deeply and extravagantly. Love as I love. Walk humbly with Me."

This is the same blessing that Adam and Eve had in the Garden as they would walk with God in the cool of the day. This is your blessing in today. Walk with the Lord. Walk in justice and love and humility. This is what the Lord requires of you. Walk humbly with your God!






# STAFF SPOTLIGHT \*
