Scripture tells us that in the last days, people will behave in a certain manner, and we need only to look at our society to see this all around us even now. Peter, Paul, Timothy and the Lord Jesus describes it in this way:

People will be self-centered and pleasure-driven, lovers of themselves, lovers of money, and lovers of pleasure rather than lovers of God. People will be proud, arrogant, and boastful. They will be disobedient, ungrateful, and unholy.

Basic moral and family structures will disintegrate, and children will be disobedient to parents, ungrateful, and unholy. People will be treacherous, reckless, and swollen with conceit. Religious hypocrisy will be dramatic. One of the most striking descriptions is that they will have “the appearance of godliness but denying its power.”

There will be widespread spiritual deception and Paul and Peter both warn that many will depart from the faith. They will follow deceitful spirits and false teachings and even mock the idea of Christ’s return.

*2 Timothy 3:1-5*

*But mark this, there will be terrible times in the last days. People will be lovers of themselves, lovers of money, boastful, proud, abusive, disobedient to their parents, ungrateful, unholy, without love, unforgiving, slanderous, without self-control, brutal, not lovers of the good, treacherous, rash, conceited, lovers of pleasure rather than lovers of God— having a form of godliness but denying its power. Have nothing to do with such people.*

With the chaos of sin surrounding us and yet having a desire to pursue holiness, how should we then live? We need to turn to God’s truth and walk in obedience to Him.

1. Live in faith, hope and peace, being filled by the Holy Spirit.

*May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that by the power of the Holy Spirit you may abound in hope. Romans 15:13*

2. Pray in the Spirit.

*Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness. For we do not know what to pray for as we ought, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us with groanings too deep for words. And he who searches hearts knows what is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God. Romans 8:26-27*

3. Avoid witchcraft and evil spirits, watching what we watch and read and play.

*Now the Spirit expressly says that in later times some will depart from the faith by devoting themselves to deceitful spirits and teachings of demons. 1 Timothy 4:1*

4. Do not join in with corrupt talk.

*Let no corrupting talk come out of your mouths, but only such as is good for building up, as fits the occasion, that it may give grace to those who hear. Ephesians 4:29*

5. Walk humbly with the Lord.

*He has shown you, O man, what is good. And what does the Lord require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God. Micah 6:8*




## Pioneer and Native American Day!

*Megan Dick*


*Middle School Language Arts & History*



